

## Early Years Pupil Premium Report March 2017

Since April 2015 early year's pupil premium (EYPP) has been available from the government for some 3 and 4 year old children to support educational outcomes. When children come to nursery, we ask parents to complete relevant information with our admissions form so that we can apply for this additional funding. The government make the decision about who is entitled to receive it, then the school receives £103 per term for each child who is eligible.

EYPP funding received to date is as follows:

This funding is used to provide additional training for all staff on local and national research projects to help them deliver more effective education for children. We join with other nursery schools and private and voluntary providers to host a nursery conference on aspects of effective teaching and learning each January. The training for staff and governors around the effectiveness of sustained shared thinking, high quality interactions and children's wellbeing will ensure we are fully aware of the value this adds to children's progress.

As part of our regular review of children's progress, we are monitoring the progress and attainment of children entitled to early year's pupil premium to ensure that they have benefited from identified interventions, and March 2017 assessments demonstrate that these children are making strong and sustained progress.
